

#### TERM Rhyme

Is related to the MAIN TERM because...

It is a poetic device that creates rhythm. Two types of Rhyme are **Internal** and **End. Internal** rhyme occurs within the same line of poetry.

**End** rhyme occurs when two words at the end of lines rhyme.

#### TERM Repetition

Is related to the MAIN TERM because...

It is a poetic device that creates rhythm. It can be repeating words, phrases, or lines in poetry

### TERM Symbol

Is related to the MAIN TERM because...
It is a poetic device that can enhance a poem's meaning. It is an object that means more than itself and represents something else.

Tools that a poet can use to...

Create rhythm Enhance a poem's meaning Intensify a mood or feeling

#### TERM Personification

Is related to the MAIN TERM because...

It is a poetic device that can enhance mood or feeling. How the poet chooses to describe the inanimate object behaving as if it's alive shapes what type of feeling will be magnified in the poem.

## TERM Onomatopoeia

Is related to the MAIN TERM because...
A poetic device that intensifies feeling because words are used that resemble or imitate sounds. Words like 'bang' and 'boom' could add intensity of violence. Words like 'tweet' and 'purr' could add tranquility.

### **Imågery**

Is related to the MAIN TERM because...

It is a poetic device that enhances a poem's meaning. A poet uses words to create an image in the reader's mind. Imagery is based on our five senses though visual imagery is used the most.
